

Sunday Greeter

Sunday greeters warmly welcome people to the church, encouraging everyone to wear/make a nametag and answering any questions they may have. Anyone can serve as a greeter. It is a great role for individuals, couples and families.

Greeters should arrive by 9:30 am

All greeters should wear their name tag

(Note: If you are unable to host on a scheduled Sunday, please find your own substitute and make the switch in SignUp Genius.)

When you arrive

- Make sure both social hall doors are unlocked. Ask the staff to help if they are not.
- Make sure nametags are in order and accessible.
- Make sure there are sticky name tags and pens on the welcome table.
- Empty the name tag table trash can into one of the other social hall trash cans.
- Place random objects in the social hall in the Lost and Found tub at the welcome table.

As people arrive

- Warmly greet folks coming in. This can mean more than just saying “Good morning!” or “Welcome to church!” Welcome them by name if you know it. Add something like, “Cute baby. How old?” or “Slippery roads. How was your drive?”
- Answer questions such as, “Where are the bathrooms?”
- Encourage visitors to make themselves a name tag at the welcome table.
- Watch for people arriving from the west hallway or the Lincoln Avenue entrance.
- Provide directions to the elevator, rest rooms, social hall or sanctuary.
- Remain in position until just before 10am, or when people stop arriving.

After Worship (leave just before postlude)

- During the fellowship hour, consider following up with anyone new you met before worship or find someone standing or sitting alone and engage them in conversation. Then, maybe introduce them to someone else.
